695,575 | 51.5%

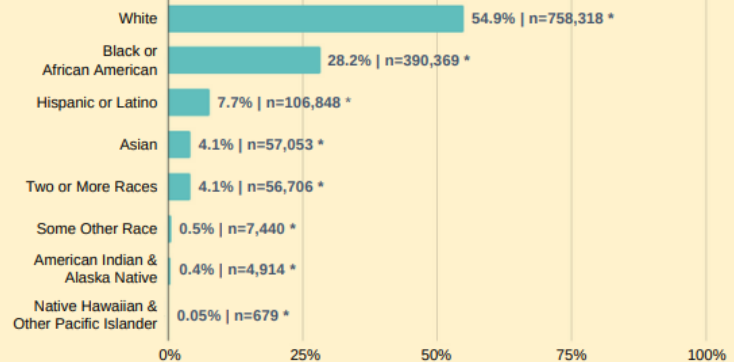
Male Population

*Out of Total Population from 2020 DEC Redistricting Data (1,382,327)



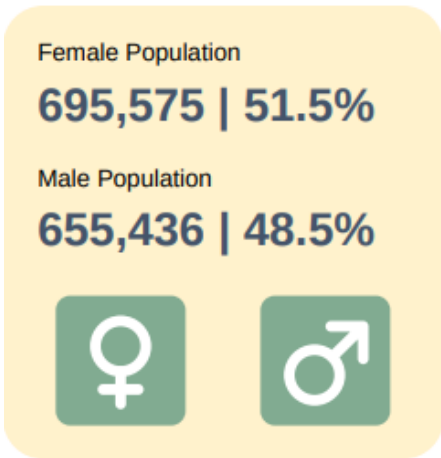

In the state of Alabama, there were a reported [2 active shooter incidences](#) and [2 natural disasters events in 2021](#).



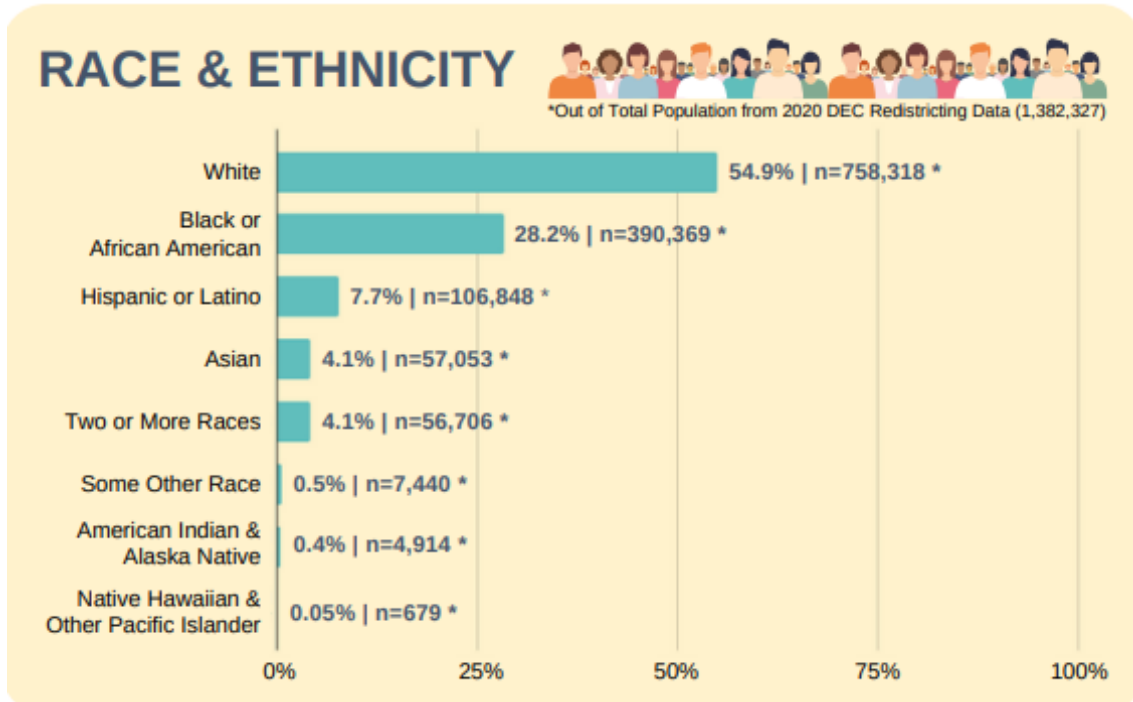
The average response time for such incidences were not reported.

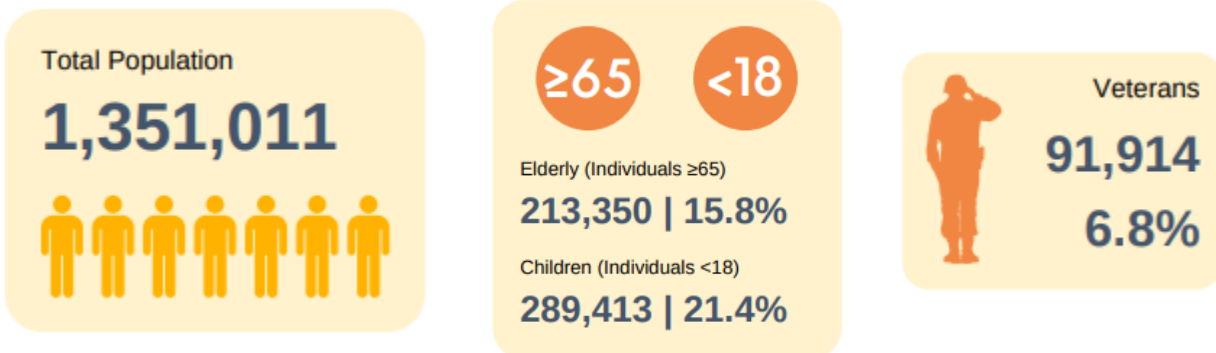

URBAN & REGIONAL PLANNING

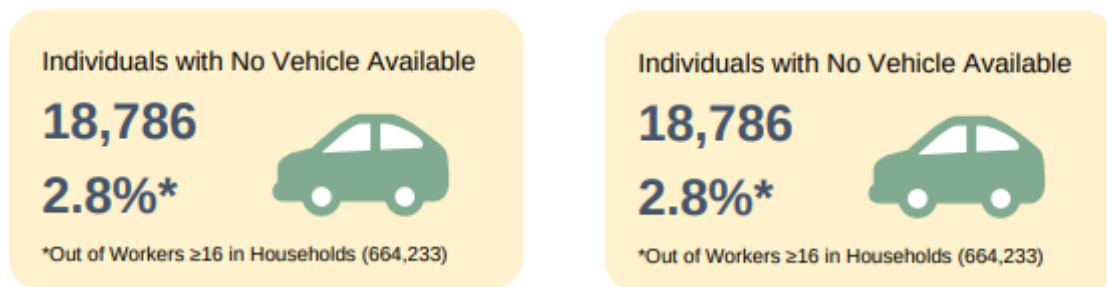
In the state of [Alabama](#), there are 93,523 subsidized units available, with 88% occupied, in the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs in 2021.

As for mobility and traffic congestion, there are 100,962 miles of public road in [Alabama](#) in 2020.

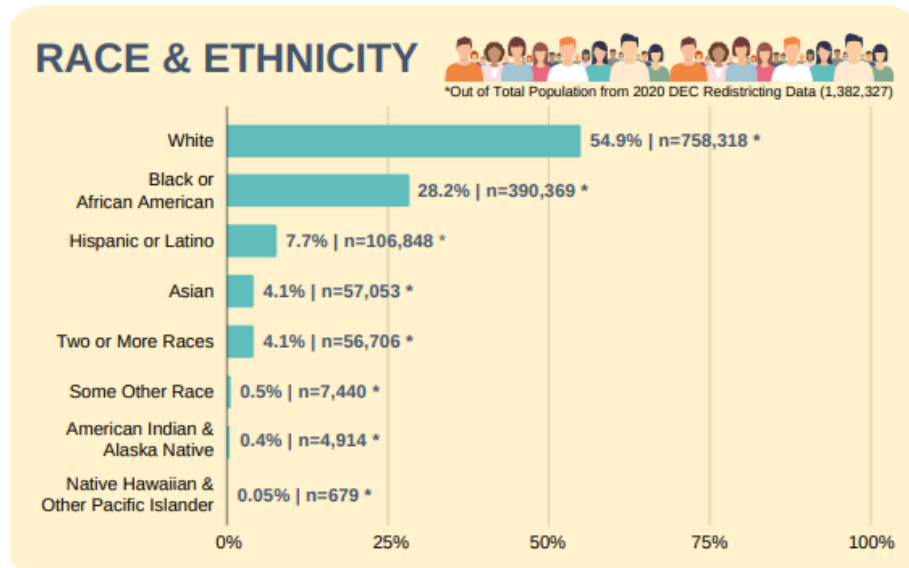
