



In the state of Alabama, as of December 2020, there were 398 per 100,000 U.S. residents incarcerated.







In the state of Alabama, there were a reported <u>2 active shooter incidences</u> and <u>2 natural disasters events in 2021</u>.









In Alabama, there are estimated 2,497 individuals who are homeless in 2020.








As for mobility and traffic congestion, there are 100,962 miles of public road in Alabama in 2020.




